In the 1962 rites the rubricist O'Connell stated

The Kiss of Peace


that the kiss of peace at Mass is given in this way among the ministers of the altar. The two persons stand facing each other with hands joined. The one who is to receive the kiss bows. Then the one who gives it lays his hands on the shoulders of the other; the receiver puts his arms under those of him who gives it. Both bow the head over the left shoulder of the other. The one who gives the kiss says "Pax tecum." The other answers "Et cum spiritu tuo." Then they stand again with folded hands facing each other, and both bow. You will still see this at a more formal celebration of Holy Mass.

The current General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) states that: "As for the actual sign of peace to be given, the manner is to be established by the Conference of Bishops in accordance with the culture and customs of the peoples. However, it is appropriate that each person, in a sober manner offer the sign of peace only to those who are nearest."

In recent times many liturgists have questioned the position and practice of the Sign of Peace in the current Missal. Pope Benedict also had some misgivings regarding the current practice.

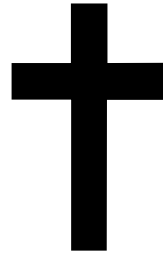
